RE: American Citizens Abroad to attend Congresswoman Titus Expat Tax Filing Press Event on June 15, 2023.

Congresswoman Titus (NV-01), a senior member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee and Chairwoman of the Americans Abroad Caucus along with American Citizens Abroad (ACA) and other organizations representing US citizens living and working overseas, will attend the “Expat Tax Filing” press event on June 15, 2023, 10:00am at the House Triangle.

Congresswoman Titus has introduced a bipartisan bill, [The Commission on Americans Living Abroad Act](#), to study the issues and problems that current tax, banking, Social Security, and voting legislation have on US citizens living and working overseas. Congresswoman Titus bill will call for the creation of a ten-member bipartisan panel that will be charged with analyzing and reporting on the issues and problems as well as, making proposals and recommendations to address and correct the legislative and regulatory concerns of US citizens living and working overseas.

“ACA advocates every day to Congress helping to educate them on the issues and problems that current US legislation and regulations create for US citizens living and working overseas. ACA has put forth recommendations for [Residence-based taxation \(RBT\)](#) and [Same Country Exemption \(SCE\)](#) for FATCA filing which would be invaluable information for the Commission to review and consider. Congresswoman Titus has been a great advocate for our community, and her legislation would greatly assist with our advocacy on Capitol Hill,” said Marylouise Serrato, ACA Executive Director.

“Our organization appreciates the support and efforts of Congresswoman Titus and other co-sponsors of this legislative effort. ACA has a wealth of knowledge that we have already shared with Congress, like our two [research studies](#) on the community of US citizens living and working overseas in support of RBT. Being able to put this information in front of a panel dedicated to these issues is key,” added Jonathan Lachowitz, ACA Chairman.

“ACA’s data clearly indicates that the majority of US citizens living and working overseas are not residing overseas or holding financial instruments for the purposes of tax evasion. Congress needs more education on why US citizens are living and working overseas so they can craft the appropriate legislation and regulations that empower our citizens to create economic opportunities throughout the globe,” said Charles Bruce ACA Legal Counsel.

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
